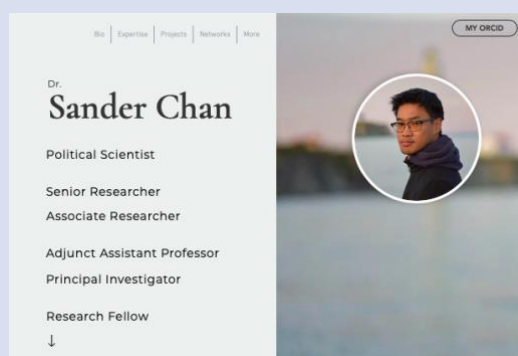


PERSONAL PROFILE

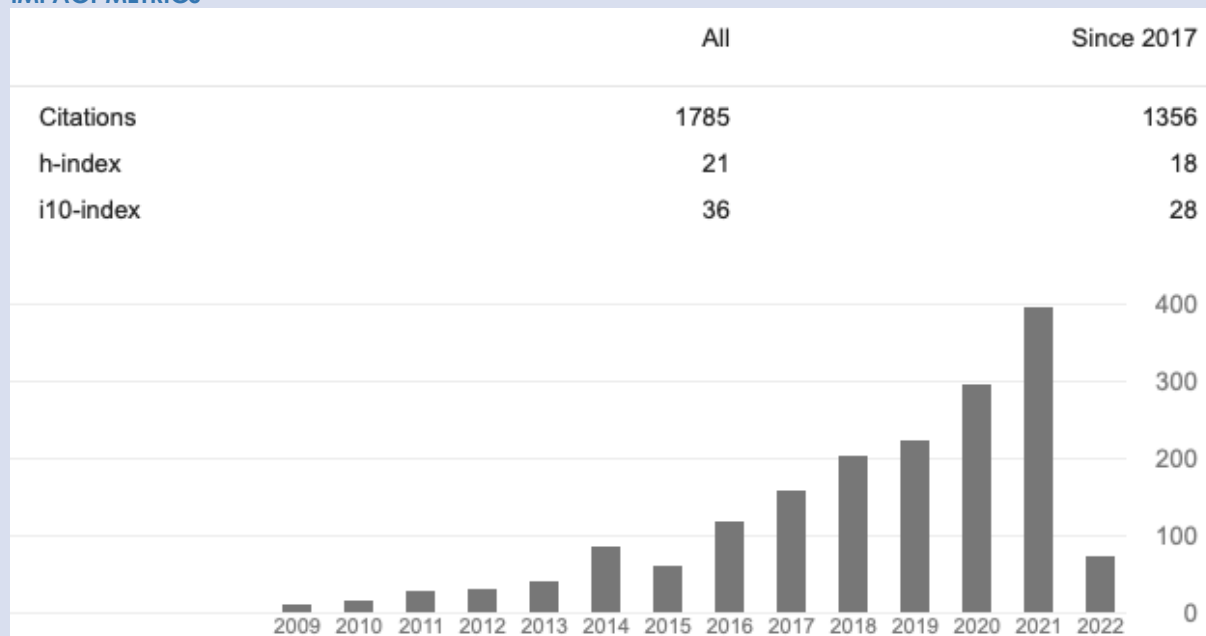
