Gender Impact Assessment (1994 - now): Dutch policymaking instrument. Imagined, funds acquired, designed and evaluated (with C. Roggeband). This Dutch GIA has been characterised as the best-developed gender analysis instrument (Bacchi 2003; Bacchi and Eveline 2005).

Gender mainstreaming (1996-now): As Chair of the Council of Europe Group of Specialists on Mainstreaming (1996-1998), right after the UN-conference in Beijing in 1995, I was responsible for the concluding report of this group that has been very influential in policy making and in academic research. Critical Frame Analysis (2003 - now): imagined, funds acquired, designed and amended (with MAGEEQ and QUING team). I am currently doing a meta-study of how the method has been used by others. A first publication on this (with M. van der Haar) has been published by the journal *Politics and Gender*.
